# What's Happened Since Our Last Newsletter-

#### We've had a high temperature of 65 and a low of 10!

We're currently in the 10 to 20 degree weather phase, but that could change tomorrow. Looking to the positive, this warm, cold, warm, cold weather pattern has forced us to realize this is the new "norm" and focus on the road problems that need to be fixed... i.e. roads that turn into swamps and/or "brownie mix" when the temperatures rise and roads that become "hockey rinks" when the temperatures plummet. #### Town Meeting Date Set

Friday, January 31st at 6:30pm is the Town Meeting to vote on Park & Recreations request to repair the tennis courts at Veterans' Field and the election of a new Region One Representative from Sharon.

#### Community Center Walk Through

Sharon Park & Recreation invited us to walk through the Community Center at 99 North Main Street to see the current condition of the building and talk about the future of the building. #### Road Crew Work & Tree Work

In December, we consulted with other regional towns (in the tri-state region) that have gravel roads, on how to plow without gouging/destroying gravel roads with the weather

switching back and forth from cold to warm and via those discussions have created a new plow attachment based on the feedback we received. Hat tip and thank you to the Cornwall road crew for the plow, Road Foreman Jamie Reid and Mark Anderson for the welding work.

It has been our goal since 2014 to use less salt on all our town managed roads for environmental and budgetary reasons. Via employee training, new sand/salt ratios and new vehicles that control the amount of materials spread, we have been successful. Salt usage has been cut 40% since 2014, and we are trying some new procedures/materials as the winter of 2020 rolls on to cut that usage down even more. Thank you to the <a href="Sharon Energy & Environment Commission">Sharon Energy & Environment Commission</a> and the <a href="Cary Institute">Cary Institute</a> for their support and assistance in this salt reduction effort.



Please remember/consider that we have 84 miles of roads to plow (28 of them gravel) and seven guys. When driveways get plowed into town roads(see above), we are the ones circling back to clean them up. For everyone's safety we ask that homeowners and contractors keep this in mind. Thank you.

# Sharon Connect Task Force: Bringing High-Speed Internet and Cell Service to Your Home

One of the biggest complaints we hear these days is that in many areas of Sharon there is not reliable Internet or cell phone coverage. We hear you. Now you will soon be hearing from us.

Several residents have banded together to form a task force, called Sharon Connect, that is committed to exploring options and making recommendations to provide and/or improve Internet connectivity and cell service for Sharon residents. The task force will be surveying all property owners in town about their Internet and cell phone needs. Sharon Connect will use that information to make recommendations to the Selectmen about cost-effective ways to provide or improve service, including installing fiber-optic cable to every home in town.

Robust and reliable Internet and cell connections are not a luxury. They are essential for our town to thrive in many ways. To name a few:

- -- business growth
- -- increase in home values
- -- student access to high-quality education resources
- -- safety at home and on the road

Please participate in the survey, which will be posted online and also distributed door-to-door to reach those who don't have online access. The results of the survey will be an important step in making a concrete plan for how to provide and/or improve service to all residents in the most cost-effective manner.

Sharon Connect is also preparing a Fact Sheet that will list how residents are currently getting high-speed Internet and cell service, in case you are looking for immediate ways to improve slow or limited connectivity at your home. These aren't long-term solutions, but they may help some people improve their service while we work on the bigger plan. We will post the Fact Sheet on the Town website. ## From the Assessor's Office- Property Tax Credits

The filing period for property tax credits is February 1, 2020 through May 15, 2020. Applications for property tax credit are available at the Assessor's Office. Office hours are Monday, 9:00am to 12:00 Noon, Wednesday and Thursday 9:00am to 12:00 Noon and 1:00pm to 4:00pm. 860-364-0205.

To qualify, a homeowner must meet the following criteria:

- -- Homeowner must live in the house for which the credit is being sought and have owned the home on or before October 1, 2019.
- -- Homeowner must have reached the age of 65 by the end of 2019, although totally disabled homeowners are eligible regardless of age.
- -- Income limits are: single \$37,000 married 45,100

Proof of all income received for 2019 must be provided. If you file an Income Tax Return, a copy must be provided. If you receive Social Security benefits, a copy of your SSA 1099 must be provided.

## **Town Garage Roof**

The Town Garage's roof is due for an upgrade. With the help of the Sharon Energy & Environment Commission and their infrared thermometer we uncovered the major sources of heat loss in the building- the roof and garage doors. Bid requests were put out to local contractors last summer(only one bid came in), so we'll do so again in the next two months and hopefully get this project completed over the Summer. The secondary idea with the new roof is a solar array to a). go Green and b). provide solar power to the Town Garage, Dog Pound, and Veterans' Field.
